As a first grader, the last thing on Kylie Copenhagen's mind was becoming an inventor. But what started on poster board is now the Ladybug Game, which is flying off shelves at Barnes and Noble stores nationwide. Now 11, Kylie was not "bugged" to talk to *WR News* about her invention.

WR News: How did you come up with the idea for the Ladybug Game?

WR News: Your dad took your game to a family friend who works in the toy industry. How did you feel when you heard that your game was going to hit store shelves?
